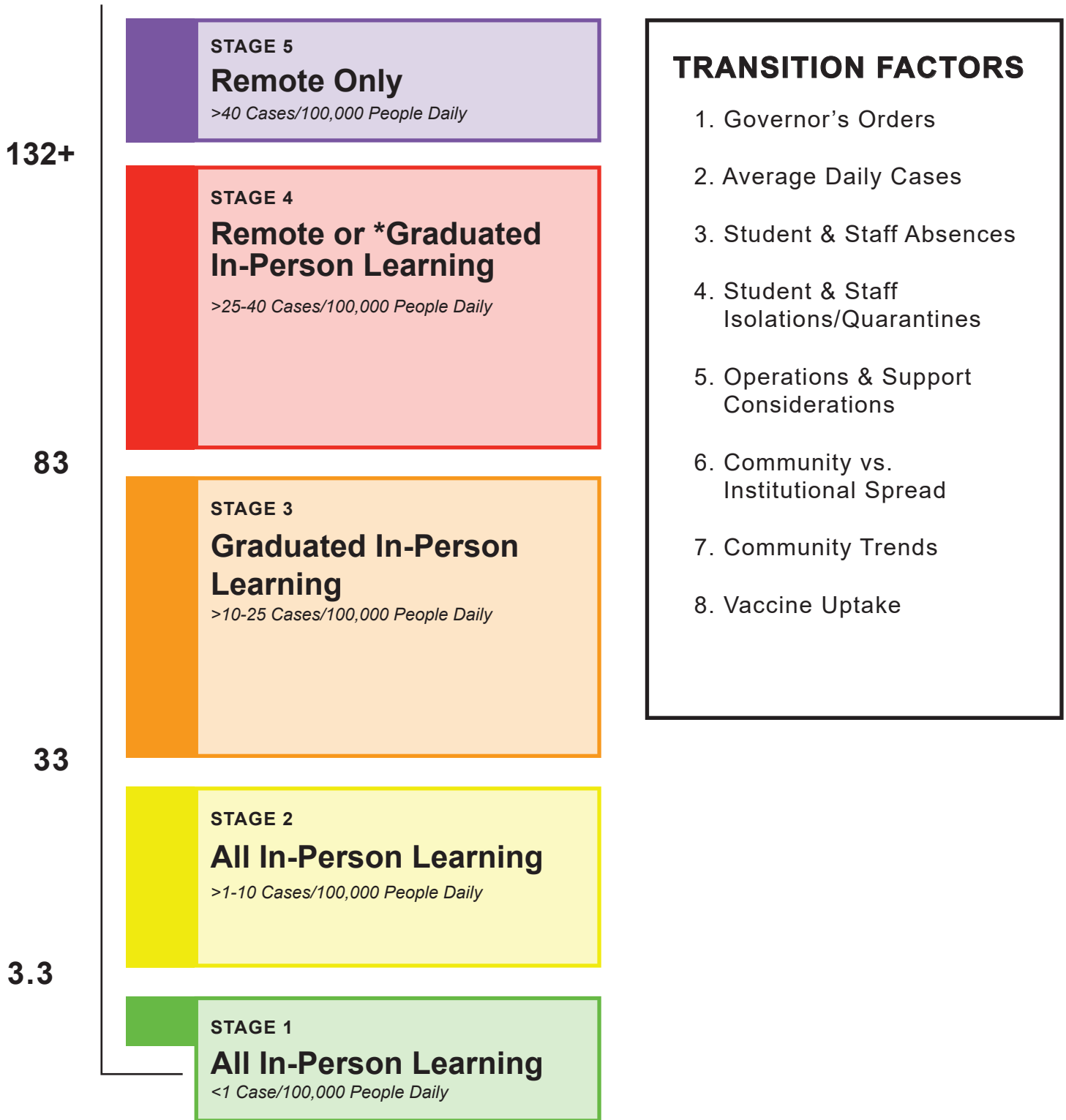


# Fayette County Public Schools COVID-19 In-Person Learning MATRIX

## COVID-19 In-Person Learning MATRIX: Stage Descriptions

### **STAGE 5 (Purple):**

**Risk of spreading COVID-19 is substantial.**

All schools are closed. Students are not physically attending school and are completing coursework through Non-Traditional Instruction: Differentiated Distance Learning (NTI: 2DL).

### **STAGE 4 (Red):**

**Risk of spreading COVID-19 is significant.**

FCPS will consider moving to remote learning with targeted services being provided for students that need extra support. Based on Fayette County Public Schools transition factors and the Fayette County Public Schools COVID-19 In-Person Learning MATRIX, a graduated in-person learning model will be considered.

### **STAGE 3 (Orange):**

**Risk of spreading COVID-19 is moderate but increasing.**

Schools are open for in-person learning. Short-term closures may occur for COVID-19 affected classrooms or buildings due to transition factors. These closures will be communicated by the school and district.

### **STAGE 2 (Yellow):**

**Risk of spreading COVID-19 is minimal.**

Schools are open for in-person learning. However, short-term closures may occur for COVID-19 affected classrooms or buildings. These short-term closures may be impacted by one or more transition factors and will be communicated by both the school and district.

### **STAGE 1 (Green):**

**Risk of community transmission of COVID-19 is low.**

All schools are open. Curriculum delivered on campus via face-to-face instruction, with blended learning strategies that integrate digital resources. FCPS will monitor and be prepared to respond to identification of COVID-19 positive tests that affect staff members or students. Additional health and safety guidelines may be enacted in consultation with the Health Department.

*Remote learning five days a week will continue to be available for families who choose that option for their students.*

*For each stage listed above, Fayette County Public Schools will follow all guidance from the KHSAA for athletics and extracurricular activities.*
