## Learning Focus

### Word Work: RF.K.1, RF.K.3

Students will be able to write their name, read the words I, can, and, it. Students will name and write the letters in the alphabet. We will continue working with our zoo phonics cards as a practice and review of all letters in the alphabet. We will focus on letters Dd, Mm, and Gg this week as we continue using our Handwriting Without Tears Workbooks.

### Reading: RL.K.1, RL.K.2, RL.K.3, RL.K.6

Students will be able to follow words in a sentence, talk about basic parts of print, tell what happened in the story, identify the characters and setting of a story, identify key details, and ask and answer questions about a story.

#### Stories from this week:

"Pouch!", "Are You My Mother", "Tortoise and the Hare", and "Baby Animals on the Move"

### Writing: W.K.3

Students will continue to tell a story with their writing (writing workshop has routines, finding a time and a topic to write, working on writing stamina, telling a story on paper through pictures and words – labeling).

#### Stories from this week:

"The Best Story" and "Arthur Writes a Story"

### Math: K.CC.A.3, K.CC.B.4, K.MD.B.3

Students will be able to count forward to 10 and use and describe math manipulatives. We will continue exploring different types of manipulatives that are in the classroom. This will help students get familiar with the materials they will be using. We will also continue sorting materials based on color, size, and shape. They will be counting to tell how many and practicing writing their numbers 1-5.
