Student & Staff IDs



- Middle and High School badges have been implemented.
- We have created a uniform badge for the coming school year that the first one for each student will be printed by the district.
- Lanyards will represent each school and all id badge materials will come through the office of the associate director of safety and security.

Upgraded Emergency Communication Systems



- Crisis Go platform is being implemented at Picadome, Morton, Lafayette, and Southside this Month. The platform will be in all schools this fall.
- Alerts –lockdown alerts can be issued through a mobile application
- Alert updates –faculty and staff can send updates on emergency situations from their classrooms or elsewhere
- Includes emergency checklists for any emergency and emergency contacts for every student
- Provides classroom rosters that are updated every evening
- Details internal emergency contacts
- Incorporates maps and diagrams of our buildings to include emergency shutoffs for water, electric, and gas
- Outlines reunification procedures
- Generates detailed incident reports

Interior and Exterior Facility Upgrades



Detex Door Alarms:

- All exterior doors have been armed.
- Forty-six schools have established door alarm protocols.

Door Access Points:

- Julius Marks, Ashland, Northern, and Dixie are complete.
- Veterans Park, Rosa Parks, ACE, Coventry Oak, Garrett Morgan, Millcreek, and Preschool are pre-wired and should all finish in May.

Security Cameras:

- Maxwell and Julius Marks are complete.
- Picadome is pre-wired.
- Harrison will begin in May.
- Ashland, Northern, Dixie, Veterans Park, Rosa Parks, and Preschools will start in June.

- DVR Camera Recorders updates are completed.

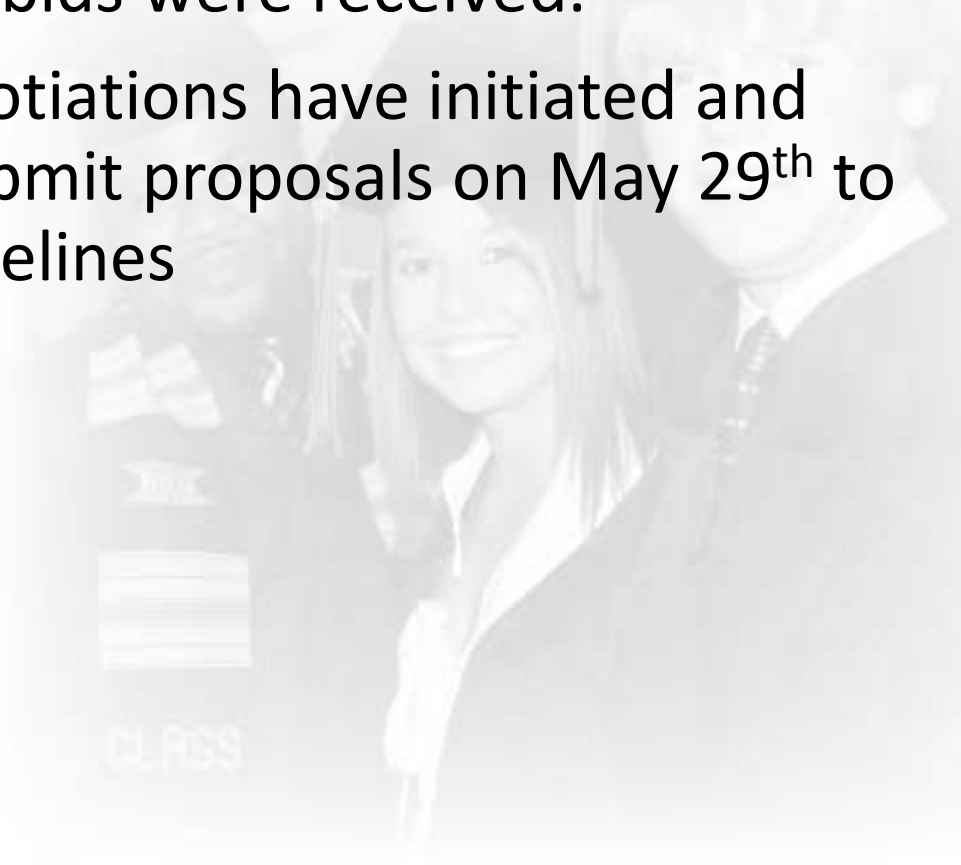

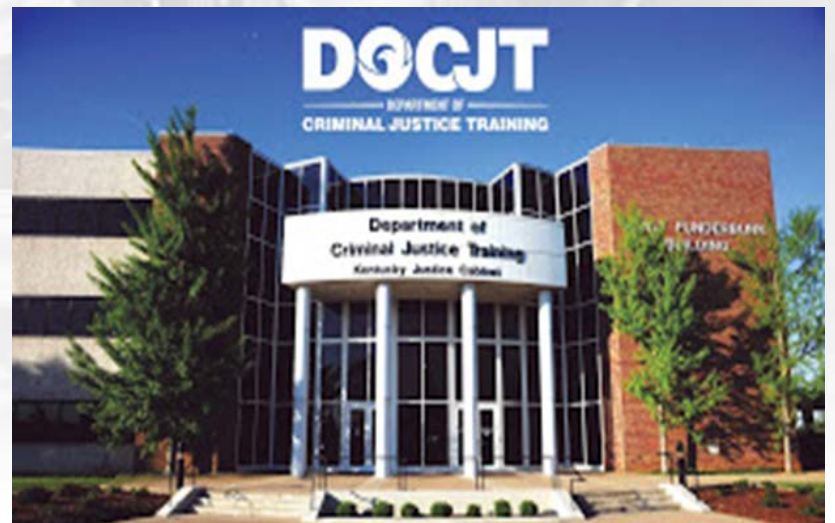
