- DVR Camera Recorders updates are completed.

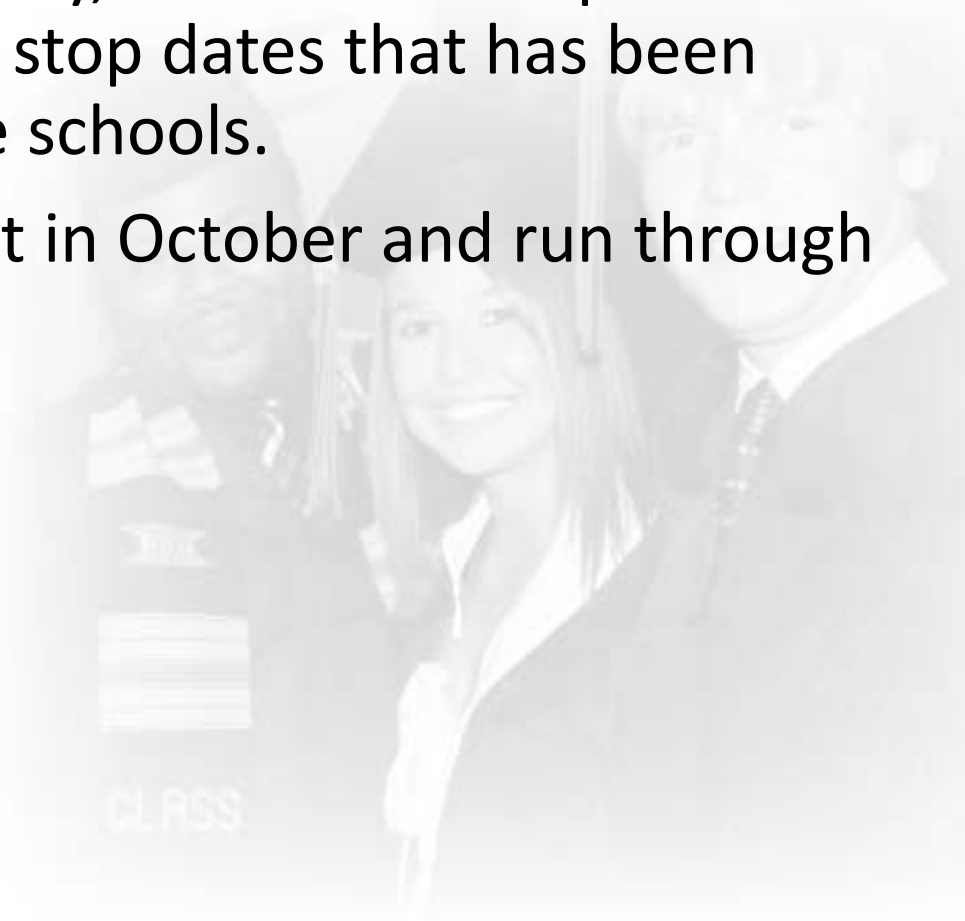

Secure Vestibules



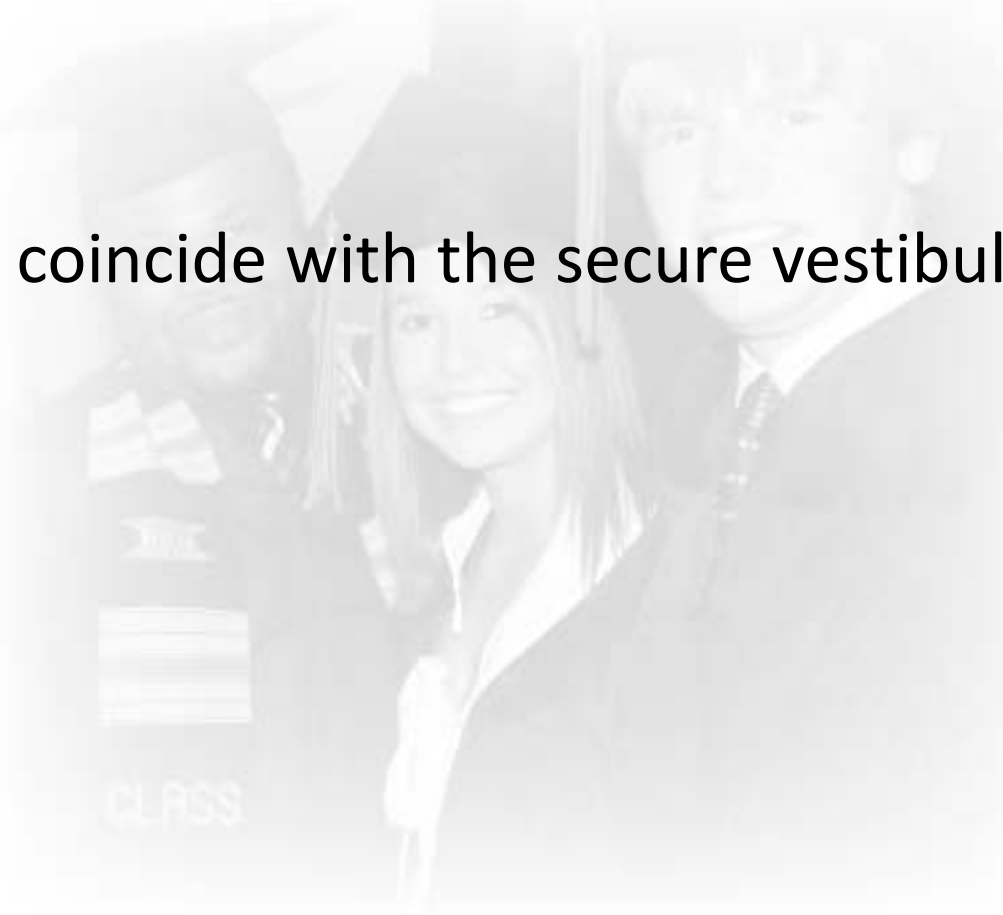
- E.C. Matthews Company, Inc. has developed a schedule of start and stop dates that has been communicated to the schools.

FBI National Academy Sergeant Gatewood



Sessions of approximately 220 officers take undergraduate and/or graduate courses at the FBI campus in Quantico, Virginia. Classes are offered in the following areas: law, behavioral science, forensic science, understanding terrorism/terrorist mindsets, leadership, communication, and health/fitness. Officers participate in a wide range of leadership and specialized training, where they share ideas, techniques, and experiences with each other.
