Student & Staff IDs and Raptor - Visitor Management System



- Middle and High School ID badges have been implemented.
- Custom lanyards for the students for the 20-21 school year have been purchased and delivered to each school.



Upgraded Emergency Communication Systems



- The Raptor Visitor Management school security system allows us to screen and track everyone coming into our schools and keep unwanted entrants out. It screens for sex offenders in all 50 states and alerts staff of custody violations.
- Displayed throughout the entire Raptor Visitor Management system platform, customizable emergency silent alert buttons allow front desk personnel to easily and discretely alert school leaders with the click of a button.
- As we begin to implement Raptor across the district for this coming school year we are in the process of approving a new district wide alert system that is an upgrade to CrisisGo.

Secure Vestibules (28 sites)



- We are continuing to have pre-construction meetings at each school several weeks before the work is scheduled to begin. Attendees for these meetings include the principal, the design team, the contractor, FCPS facilities, FCPS maintenance, and FCPS IT staff.
- Construction is complete at **(14)** Schools: Bryan Station High, Booker T. Washington, Crawford Middle, Northern, The Professional Learning Center on Spurr Road, Winburn Middle, The Learning Center on Price Road, Dixie, The Preschool Center, Southside, Picadome, Lafayette High, Morton Middle and SCAPA.
- Construction is approximately 98% complete at Harrison, Ashland, and Maxwell Elementary Schools, as well as Dunbar High School.
- Construction is approximately 80% complete at Beaumont MS, Eastside, MLK, and Henry Clay High School
- Construction is approximately 50% complete at Southern MS.
- Preconstruction meetings have been scheduled for Rosa Parks, Veterans, and Southern Elementary Schools.
- Remaining schools include: Julius Marks and Lansdowne Elementary Schools.

Metal Detectors and Security Ambassadors



- Maintenance has been done on all metal detectors at the high schools and are ready for when students return.
- We now have metal detectors at all high schools.

As of January 8, 2020

There are a total of 50 District Mental Health Specialists serving students across the district; 39 at elementary schools, 4 serving middle schools, and 6 serving high schools, 1 itinerant. DMHS continue to participate in PLC's working on trauma informed care; tier one prevention; equity, diversity and restorative practices.

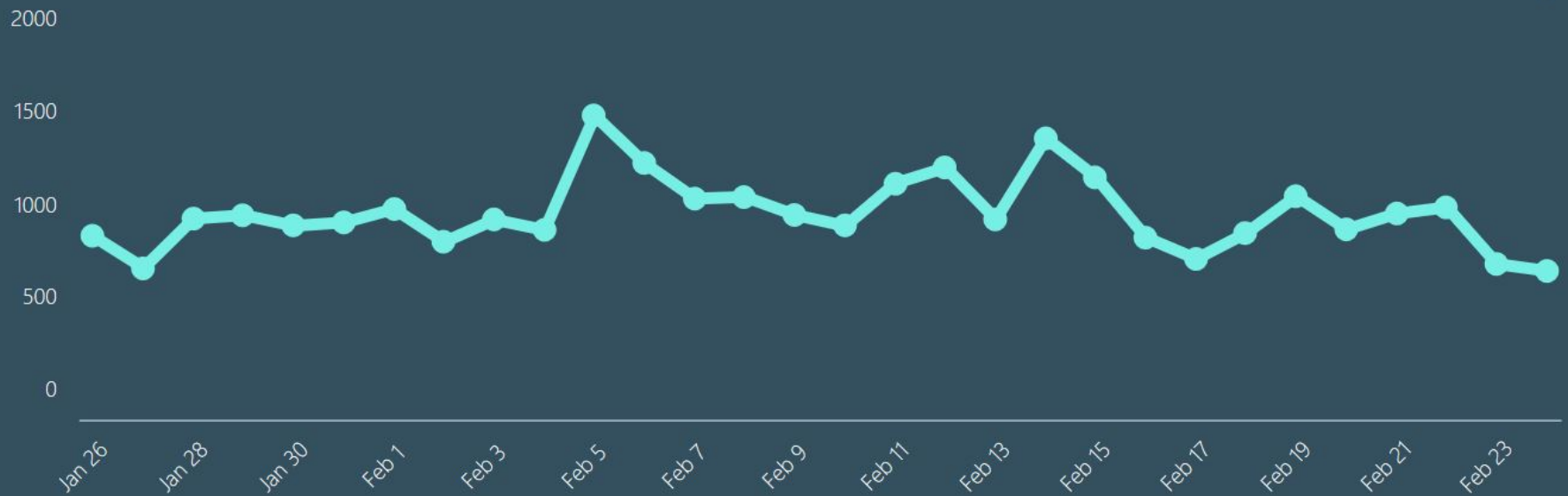

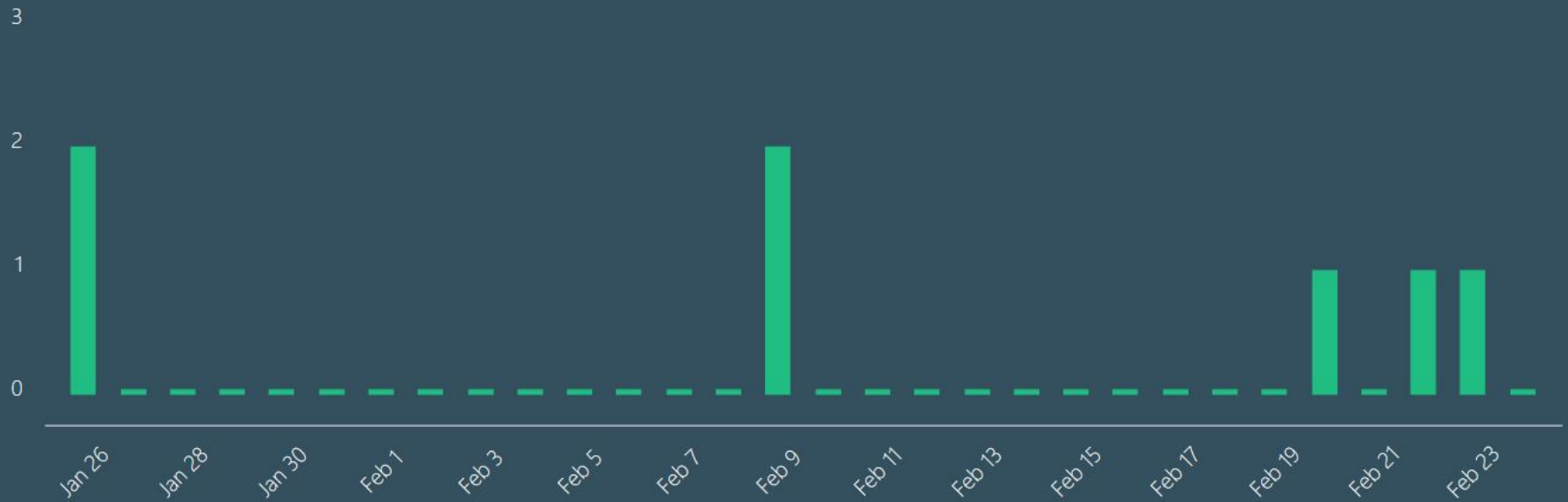

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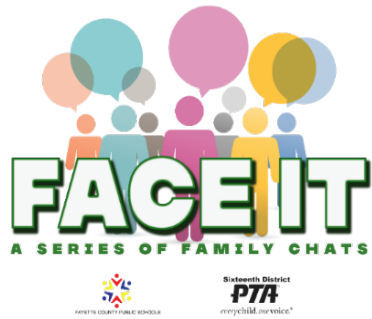
