Fayette County Public Schools is pleased to offer students the at-home use of Chromebooks in an effort to increase student collaboration, creativity, critical thinking, and communication. Use of these devices is a **privilege** that comes with responsibility. Students must obtain parental/guardian permission and must sign and return this pledge to the designated teacher/staff before the equipment can be checked out.

Intentional or wanton misuse or damage of any school equipment is considered a Class III Code violation (*Property Damage of Vandalism; Criminal Mischief*) that has the potential to result in consequences outside the district (*Student Code of Conduct*, pp. 19-24). h addition, the student/parent/guardian may be held financially responsible should the equipment be lost or damaged. If equipment checked out to a student is stolen, the student/parent/guardian is responsible for immediately notifying the school's Student Technology Coordinator/Digital Learning Coach so that he or she may contact the FCPS Police Department.

Acceptable Use

Student use of a Chromebook falls under the FAYETTE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS *Student Code of Conduct*. This User Agreement still requires students to have a signed *FCPS Acceptable Use Policy* on file with the school.

Student Chromebook Pledge

- 1. I will bring my fully-charged Chromebook to school each day I am in attendance.
- 2 I am responsible for the care, monitoring, and protection of my Chromebook at all times.
- 3 I will complete any required Digital Citizenship instruction and practice it daily.
- 4 I understand that the Chromebook is for educational use only. It is not a toy.
- 5 I will keep my Chromebook away from food and drink.
- 6 I will report loss, theft, and/or malfunction immediately.
- 7. I will not share my Student Account information with anyone.
- 8 I will not change the appearance of my Chromebook with drawings or stickers. I will keep the Asset Tags and any barcode labels on the Chromebook.
