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What Can Parents Do to Encourage Positive Behavior at Home?

- *Talk with your child about their day (What was fun? What did you eat for lunch? What challenged you today? What would you rate your day on a scale of 1 to 10? Why? etc.)*
- *Ask how they show being safe, kind or responsible at school*
- *Model good behavior*
- *Encourage their good behavior by noticing*
- *Help your child to be on time to school*
