What is The Success Academy

This program is designed to support, re-engage, and accelerate FCPS students who are over-age and undercredited in earning a high school diploma and to successfully transition them to college and/or the workforce.

Who is Eligible for the Program?

Students who are 16 years of

age or older, one or more grade levels behind their peers. They have repeated a year of more of high school course work.

Applications are reviewed on the third Wednesday of every month. The Success Academy operates a continuous admission process and accepts students into the program throughout the school year.

Applications must be received by 7p.m. on the 2nd Friday of each month to be considered for enrollment during the current month's review team meeting.

If the program roster has reached capacity, students are placed on a waiting list in the order their application was received.



What Curriculum Model Is Used?

A blended learning curriculum (i5 Alternative Learning Curriculum) is implemented. Highly qualified teachers facilitate instructional delivery along with digital curriculum and provide teacher-directed individual, whole, or small group instruction and remediation. In addition we participate in community outreach

programs as well as Project Based Learning.
