I. Opening Business

- a. Call meeting to order at 3:32, motion made by G. Webb, second by M. Skeel. Attendance: Grant Davis (principal), Kevin Lyne (parent), Scott Sheets (teacher), Melissa Skeel (teacher), Gayla Webb (teacher), Gayla Anderson (teacher), Madison Raymer (visitor), Kathy Theis (secretary). Not in attendance: Bret Ripley (parent).
- b. Approval of Agenda, motion made by K. Lyne, second by M. Skeel.
- c. Approval of September regular and special meeting minutes (9/3/19 and 9/17/19): Motion to approve the minutes with changes made by G. Webb, second by M. Skeel.
- d. Public Comment

II. Student Achievement Report/Data

- a. 2018-2019 K-PREP Results: Overall score shared in the public release this morning of 80.1, a 4-star rating. This score is the 3rd highest in Fayette County and 29th in the state of Kentucky. The scores in comparison from 2017-2018 to 2018-2019 are as follows: Proficiency- Reading 74.2 to 81.4, Math-68.1 to 71.8, Writing-60.6 to 74, Social Studies-89 to 90.6, and Science 54.4 to 56.9. Combined proficiency: Reading/Math Combined-88.4 to 93.9 and Science/Social Studies/Writing-86.9 to 88.9. By individual grade level achievement gap groups for reading, the data is as follows: 3rd grade 81.4, free/reduced lunch 62.5, and disability 33.3. 4th grade 78.9, free/reduced lunch 56.1, and disability 42.1. 5th grade 84.4, free/reduced 80.5, disability 81.8. By individual grade level achievement gap groups for math, the data is as follows: 3rd grade 80.2, free/reduced lunch 66.7, and disability 22. 4th grade 69.7, free/reduced lunch 46.3, and disability 36.8. 5th grade 66.7, free/reduced 58.5, disability 18.2. This will help us guide next steps of our school improvement planning to support the gaps being noted, specifically in the area of students with disabilities in math.
- b. Fall MAP Performance: Reading MAP percentile for each grade level is as follows: 1st grade-92%ile, 2nd grade-86%ile, 3rd grade-85%ile, 4th grade-97%ile, and 5th-88%ile. Math MAP percentile for each grade is as follows: 1st grade-94%ile, 2nd grade-79%ile, 3rd grade-84%ile, 4th grade-86%ile, and 5th-84%ile.

- c. Primary Report Card Review: Kindergarten modified their report card to reflect the updated standards and focused on power standards. Student and Teacher in the box below the mission statement to match font size as well as be in bold text. Reporting Codes label in box below this to be in bold text. In Foundational Skills, last statement delete (accurate, precise, and speed), and add period to the end of that statement. In Informational, second statement, add a c to cover. In Literature, second statement, add comma after settings. In Writing, fourth statement, add an after write.

III. School Improvement Planning

- a. Monthly Review and Timeline: We are currently in the needs assessment phase using recently released and reviewed data as well as survey feedback to determine next steps.

IV. Budget Report

a. MUNIS and Activity Fund Reports: Currently we have spent close to \$11,000. We have Energy Award money (\$2,685.61) to be spent on an activity or club. Mr. Davis and Ms. Webb shared a 5th grade landscaping project to tie into Lexington Tree Week. This money can also help pay for the concrete to set up the benches made from bottle caps collected. A motion to use this money for both mentioned projects made by G. Webb, second by M. Skeel.

IV. New Business

- a. Extended Field Trip Request: Mrs. Anderson shared the 2nd grade extended day field trip to the Louisville Zoo projected to take place on April 24, 2020. This trip is a culminating activity for the Organism Extravaganza. The current cost is \$28 per child but with fundraising it will change. Motion to approve made by M. Skeel, second by K. Lyne.
- b. Ongoing Council Learning
Legal Updates: Two laws shared by the commissioner to be reviewed are "In God We Trust" legislation (KRS 158.195) and "Student Bill of Rights" (KRS 158.183).
