STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT/REPORT DATA

- a. Measuring Student Achievement : Nothing to report today but we have completed 3rd grade Gifted/Talented testing (CoGAT/IOWA) which provides additional data for student achievement and if additional students qualify for gifted and talented services. We are currently completing the winter round of MAP in all grades.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLANNING

- a. 2023-2025 School Improvement Plan - Phase 4 - Goals/Objectives/Strategies/Activities: The Comprehensive School Improvement Plan is a three year plan which has eight goals, annual objectives, and activities to meet the goals. The goals are as follows:
 - i. By 2025, Clays Mill Elementary will increase in reading proficient and distinguishes level to 80% as measured by KSA. Current level is 73%.
 - ii. By 2025, Clays Mill Elementary will increase math proficient and distinguished level to 70% as measured by KSA. Current level is 63%.
 - iii. By 2025, Clays Mill Elementary will increase science proficient and distinguished level to 66% as measured by KSA. Current level is 59%.
 - iv. By 2025, Clays Mill Elementary will increase social studies proficient and distinguished level to 81% as measured by KSA. Current level is 74%.
 - v. By 2025, Clays Mill Elementary will increase combined writing proficient and distinguished level to 76% as measured by KSA. Current level is 69%.
 - vi. By 2025, Clays Mill Elementary will increase English Learning progress to 100% growing 1.5 levels or higher on the ACCESS assessment.
 - vii. By 2025, Clays Mill Elementary will decrease novice with identified achievement gap groups in reading and math to <15%; science to <21%; social studies to <23%; combined writing to <10% as measured by KSA.

- viii. By 2025, Clays Mill Elementary will increase the quality of school climate and safety index to 82.7 as measured by KSA. Current level is 75.7.

The annual objectives break the percentage increase/growth down for student achievement specific to 2023, 2024, 2025 goals. Some activities projected to reach the three year goal will be embedded into Professional Learning Communities work (PLCs), observations, culturally responsive high yield engagement strategies, common unit assessments and data analysis, vertical planning opportunities, increasing student voice, and co-teaching training and implementation.
