A. 21-22 Staffing Allocation - Mr. Marsh reviewed district controlled staffing for Special Ed. That will remain the same as this year: 4 SpEd. teachers and 9 paras. We will also keep 1.0 G/T teacher. We will have 1.6 ELL staffed.

The current year funding uses a four year average to determine staffing (612 students).

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Discretionary is funded 150 to 1. Media Specialist 1.0. Clerical is funded at 3.0. Safe para 1.0. Computer para 1.0. Early Entry para 5.0. Primary para 6.0. Guidance Counselor 1.0 TPGES Coach 1.0. Custodial 3.0. 18 primary teachers will be funded. 6.5 intermediate teachers will be funded. Using these numbers, Mr. Marsh will use staff feedback to create proposals to present to the council.

- B. Sandersville Summer Ignite Proposal** - S. Williams shared the proposal for summer school, *The Summer Ignite Program*. There are three sessions available that will provide engaging in-person learning experiences for K-5 students. Ms. Williams presented the dates of the sessions and the considerations for identifying the students who need to participate. Students will receive Math, ELA, Science/Social Studies, and SEL content, as well as ELL support for those who need it. Each session will be centered around a particular theme. Fridays will include some kind of enrichment activity like virtual field trips that match the theme. Ms. Williams pointed out that we have lots of teacher interest. Breakfast and lunch will be provided as well as transportation. We will continue to use the Caring School Community SEL program to support the social and emotional needs of our students. On March 10, a family survey will be sent to parents to gauge engagement.

V. Deep made a motion to approve the Summer Ignite program proposal. C. Wells seconded the motion. All were in favor.
