

SOUTHERN ELEMENTARY DRESS CODE POLICY



The Southern Elementary Dress Code is to provide guidelines for appropriate attire and appearance which is strongly correlated to success. The dress code is meant as a guide and cannot possibly cover all situations. Students are to be neatly dressed and well-groomed at all times. The school administration reserves the right to prohibit any attire it deems disruptive or inappropriate.

The following items may not be worn inside the school building with the exception of Spirit Days or otherwise permitted by the principal:

- Hats, toboggans, hoodies, bandanas or nylon caps.
- Sunglasses or gloves.
- Chains/necklaces of inappropriate size or with inappropriate symbols.

The following Upper Body wear is prohibited:

- Bare backs, bare midribs, bare shoulders.
- Shirts/tops with inappropriate language, pictures, rips or tears.
- Heavy coats inside the building during class time.
- Any clothing resembling lingerie.

The following Lower Body wear is prohibited:

- Pants, shorts or skirts that sag below the waist or reveal any part of any undergarment.
- Short shorts, cutoffs, mini skirts, bike shorts.
- Any Lower Body wear with inappropriate language, pictures, rips or tears.

The following Footwear is prohibited:

- Shoes with wheels (“Heelies”).
- Heels higher than one inch
- Tennis shoes are required for the days students are scheduled for Physical Education class.

Non-Specified:

Any items considered inappropriate by the school administrator

DRESS CODE VIOLATIONS

- Students will be required to correct each Dress Code Violation
- Parents may be notified with each violation
- Parents may be contacted to bring appropriate clothing if the violation cannot be corrected at school
- Repeat Dress Code Violations may result in further action
