VI. CSIP Update

- a. Ramage discussed the update of CSIP. Proficiency goal is 35.9% in reading and 30% in math. Separate Academic Indicator for science, social studies, and writing to 31.2%, 39.7%, and 39.7% respectively. Achievement gap goal is to increase African American scores to 19.3% and 26.7% in math and reading, respectively. Growth goal is 63.1% and 55.4% in reading and math respectively. Corso mentioned goals seem realistic and attainable.
