1. REVIEW/APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

Crystal Dixon moved to approve minutes from the January 14th meeting as amended, Halee Kennon seconded, motion passed

4. TECHNOLOGY UPDATES

Mark Wombles reported that says there has been much growth in technology. Morton Middle School now has 424 Chromebooks; two carts per grade level, per team. The once Blended Learning Lab is now a Chromebook Lab. Machines in the Blended Learning Lab were pushed out to teachers' classrooms. For the future, it is hopeful to turn the library into a Chromebook lab, and push library computers out to teachers, as well as update projectors in the classrooms. Mr. Wombles noted that Morton is one of the only schools in the district that is completely accommodated with Windows 10.

There are 14-15 students helping with technology at Morton. These students are attending training to become Google level 1 certified with the district's technology coordinator. The goal is to have these students help classroom teachers. Morton is the only school that is training students in this capacity.

5. EXTENDED FIELD TRIP APPROVAL

Clay Sutherland gave a brief presentation on an extended field trip planned for the Morton Men of Integrity. Mr. Sutherland, Mrs. Combs, and Mrs. Mulazim work with these students before and after school, as well as other times. About 10 students expect to attend the field trip. Crystal Dixon moved to approve the field trip, Halee Kennon seconded. The motion passed.

Crystal Dixon brought up the idea of a 7th grade extended field trip to the zoo, which would use charter busses. The field trip is scheduled for the second Friday in April. Rubin Jones moved to approve, Allie O'Donnell seconded, motion passed.

6. MAP TESTING

MAP testing is closed. Growth in both areas, math and reading. (Check recording for specific notes. ACCESS test for English Language Learners occurred; these scores will be incorporated with the state testing scores. Paper work for the ACCESS test was sent to the state for review.

7. LEARNING CHECKS

Teacher members of the council reported that students worked really hard during the learning check from February 6th and 7th. The scores from this learning check will be counted as a quarter grade test score.

8. SCIF YEAR-TO-DATE BUDGET REPORT

The budget report was distributed. There were no questions.
