Character Bags

Please complete one bag for each book.

For this assignment, please read a book from the 7th grade summer reading list and choose a memorable character from that book. You will need a paper bag or a shopping bag/gift bag (not a plastic bag) and art supplies.

On the front of the bag, draw a picture or glue a clip art image or photo of your character. You may glue or staple pictures to the bag or draw directly on the bag.

On one side panel, write two paragraphs about your character's likes and dislikes. Use supporting evidence from the text. You may type your information, print it, and glue or staple it to the bag or write directly on the bag. On the opposite side panel, write one or two paragraphs about how other characters in the text react and interact with your character. Please use supporting information from the text.

On the back of the bag, write a paragraph or list several ways your character changes throughout the text. End with a one paragraph reflection of why the character changed.

Inside the bag, include FIVE items you associate with your character. Be creative! These items can be actual artifacts or clip-art images.

You will be asked to present your assignment orally during the first two weeks of the school year. You should be prepared to briefly explain the information on the sides and back of the bag. Please do not read the information aloud word for word. You also will be asked to show the FIVE items you included in the bag and explain how each item represents your character or would be important to your character.
