1. **Agenda Approval**—Agenda was submitted and reviewed by council. Beth Garner moved to approve and Amy Sohner seconded. Approved by consensus.
2. **Minutes Approval**—Minutes from December 2, 2019 were submitted and reviewed by council. Sohner moved to approve and Shayna Langston seconded. Approved by consensus.
3. **Public Comment**—not applicable. (No public)
4. **Financial Reports/MUNIS**—Jessica Boeglin briefly reviewed November bank statement, SAF fund, and MUNIS funds. The council were surprised how much CASTLE, our after school program, continues to profit and supports all areas of the school.
5. **SEL**—Sabrina Adkins told the council that the district of Fayette County Public Schools is going to purchase a SEL (social and emotional learning) program to begin next year. If the council does not vote yes to this program, Squires would be responsible to seek out and purchase a tier one SEL program to implement next year. The district's program is called *Caring School Community*. It comes with thirty weeks of set curriculum. Anne Vandervort had a concern that the teachers might not have the time to do another set lesson plan. Garner and Langston agreed. Langston also explained that social and emotional lesson are currently being taught as needed to individuals and the class. After looking through the sample of *CSC*, the council approved the implement the program next year. Kim Hayes-Haskins and Lisa Norton will be trained on the curriculum and in turn train the staff.
6. **CSIP**—Adkins shared the final draft of the CSIP plan with the council. Proficiency goals for reading is 64.4% and math is 66.9% by May 2021. TNTP and PLC meetings will be implemented to monitors individuals and to discuss new

practices within grade level teams. Changes were made on page 4 by adding a combined goal of 53.8% in Science, Social Studies, and Writing. Squires will be adopting *Amplify* next school year for our science curriculum. Fifth grade is already using *Simple Solutions* to support writing curriculum. Achievement Gap for African American students will increase from 40% to 52% by May 2021. Overall growth will grow one point per year to 79.3% by May 2021.

- 7. MAP Data**—Adkins shared data of the winter MAP testing scores. Adkins reviewed each grade level compared to the country who are also implementing MAP testing. Overall, Squires is excelling in both Math and Reading scores with the exception of the 2nd grade team. During PLCs this week, administration will be looking further into the 2nd grade team to see to how progress (additional support, etc.).
