

SBDM Meeting--Squires Elementary

1. **Agenda Approval**—Agenda was submitted and reviewed by council. Shayna Langston moved to approve and Amy Sohner seconded. Approved by consensus.
2. **Approval of Minutes**—Minutes from February 1st were reviewed by council. Sohner moved to approve and Heidi Thompson-Abell seconded. The council approved by consensus.
3. **Public Comment**—None
4. **Financial Reports/MUNIS**—SAF and MUNIS reports were reviewed by Jessica Price. Price reported that all teacher spending has ended and total spending money is \$9,627.68 from both section 6 and carry forward funds with allowing the maximum carry forward amount for next year. Carry forward funds for next year is 15% of section 6 funds, which is \$6,765. Price had allocated some end of the year spending (Scholastic News, copy paper, stockroom restock, etc.) which left about \$5,222 for additional spending. Squires plans to use this to restock the book room. Student accounts were then reviewed by Price. No new news to report. Ms. Rose will be hosting a fundraiser to help pay for The NED Show.
5. **Imagine Language and Literacy Usage**—Adkins reviewed a report of how often Imagine Language and Literacy is used a Squires. Usage in all grades is lower than the district percentage. Imagine Learning will be purchased by the district and will be a focus. Adkins will talk with staff to help grow usage and will provide training this summer to grow program knowledge with teachers. Adkins said that Squires teachers will not be putting emphasis on this program right now, but will for next year.
6. **In-person and Remote Learning**—Adkins provided a quick review of how in-person learning and remote learning has gone over the last few days. K-2 in-person has gone really well and teachers are excited to have the rest of the school return on Wednesday, March 3rd. Sohner commented that her daughter's teachers is doing a great job communicating/explaining/preparing her daughter

to return to school. Adkins said that some teachers are being creative and having their remote student be “live” during school to help them feel inclusive and have the best remote experience possible. Stipends are also being provided for teachers who are teaching remote students outside of the normal school day.
