## **SBDM Council DRAFT Minutes**

### **Special Called Meeting**

#### **1. Opening Business**

- a. The August 11 Agenda was approved at 5:34.
- b. The July 28 SBDM Minutes were approved at 5:36.

#### **2. Budget Reports**

- a. Dr. Fine reported that there were not any changes to the budget to review at the time of the meeting.

#### **3. Next Steps Follow UP**

- a. Dr. Fine reviewed how families will request help for food, rent, and mental health support. She shared that 28 families will not be able to pick up food at school. Krista Mason, will continue to work to provide services for these families. Dr. Fine explained that students attending the virtual learning academy will following the FCPS pacing guide to prevent any gaps in their learning when returning to traditional instruction at Glendover.

#### **4. Title 1**

- a. Dr. Fine explained the Title 1 grant and programs.
- b. The district has provided an additional \$3,200 Title 1 funds for schools to purchase resources. Dr. Fine has requested input from grade level teachers on resources to purchase to help with remote learning. One option is to purchase Scholastic Literacy Pro, an independent reading program.
- c. Lucy Waterbury suggested purchasing PBIS rewards to improve engagement in remote learning.

#### **5. Virtual Learning Academy Update**

- a. Students who participate in the Virtual Learning Academy will be withdrawn from Glendover, but may participate in school clubs, etc.

- b. At the time of this SBDM Council meeting there was not a specific plan for the Virtual Learning Academy.

**6. Master Schedule**

- a. Dr. Fine reviewed the master schedule for virtual learning. The Council discussed the various components and felt it was a good start in creating a schedule that is student centered.

**7. Enrollment**

- a. The total enrollment is at 526 students. Thirty-eight families have withdrawn to other schools or who are returning their home country.
