A motion was made at 5:01 p.m. to begin the meeting by Ms. Nathaniel , was seconded by Ryan Popplewell and was found favorable.

- BSHS Swim- BOys relay made it to state and Crosby Nathaniel qualified in the individual 100 fly medley relay.

5. ESS: Dr. Caroline Morales presented to the SBDM regarding the current status of ESS and the upcoming Summer Ignite program. 1140 students have been identified. Special Education teachers are currently drawing plans to make sure all IEPs are met. Communication has gone out through flyers, postcards, and social media shares for promotion of Summer Ignite. Community partners will be brought in for the enrichment sessions. There will also be EL student enrichment, SPED Skill enhancement and initial credit opportunities.

6. Dual Credit- Brandi Ogden presented to the council requesting for approval of 1 semester of dual credit to count as one full credit per semester. It currently counts for half of a credit for MA 150, MA155, English 101 and English 102. A motion was made to approve by Ms. George, seconded by Ms. Nathaniel and none were opposed.

7. Budget and Staffing: A motion was made by Col. Coker to approve stipends for two special education paraeducators for SCM training was seconded by Mr. Popplewell and none were opposed.

8. Student Learning: There are currently 3,226 As, 3,168 Bs, 2,706 Cs, 11Ds and 2,194 Fs and 172 Ns. Out of 12,000 grades there are 2,000 Fs. There have been 400 walkthroughs conducted by administration. Some have been virtual. Of the walk through and observations performed by Mr.

Hale he has seen 100% of the students in classes actively engaged. Another highlight has been the continued approach of blended learning from our faculty. Differentiation and instructional videos are still embedded in Canvas. This enables a teacher in a single class to have multiple students working at different levels at the same time. Progress trackers are being utilized and help record student success at all levels.

8. Principals Report: The district has offered a .5 position for Chinese for next year. A motion was made to approve this position by Mr. Popplewell, was seconded by Col Coker and was found favorable.

Ms. Cohn STC and TRT met with CIA committee recently regarding Canvas. She is in the process of finalizing the results. The council requested to have a committee formed to ensure everyone is fairly represented in the data. Mr. Hale will meet with Ms. Cohn on April 22, 2021 and will request a committee be formed.

Mr. Hale spoke with Mr. Doug Adams regarding more PBIS training with a focus towards restorative practices. This will be offered for not only Bryan Station faculty, but also our feeder schools.

Abby Jackson shared that we are in the process of hiring a boys and a girls basketball coach. Finals are set to be the 11th of May through the 14th. Graduation is on May the 20th and Prom is on May the 22nd. Kprep is May the 5th. May 18th is the last day for students.

9. Financial Reports: Ms. Simonds presented the financial reports for Section 6 District Activity Funds and Student Activity Funds. Mr. John Grant asked for clarification of the PO process and Ms. Simonds defined.
